

ANSWERS

CONTEXT REVIEW:

1. The Alaska earthquake was a 9.2. It lasted nearly five minutes.
2. Valdez was not built on solid ground. It was built on tiny pieces of smashed up rock packed tightly together. When the earthquake hit, the ground-up rock turned to mush, and the waterfront fell into the sea.
3. The town leaders decided to move the town of Valdez four miles away, to more solid ground.
4. The village of Chenega was washed away by a tsunami after the earthquake. Twenty-six out of the seventy-five people who lived there were killed.
5. The four layers of the earth are crust, mantle, outer core, and inner core. Earthquakes occur on the crust, where the plates are.

PROBLEM AND SOLUTION EXERCISE:

1. Jackson used his shovel to dig a hole beneath a pine tree. He climbed in and stayed warm and dry with his parka hood over his head until the snow stopped.
2. They use their emergency supplies to stay in the area for the night, and then they walk to Glennallen to find Uncle Solly.
3. Jackson runs out of the classroom to the bathroom, so he doesn't have to throw up in front of the class.
4. On his first day of school, Jackson feels like he's talked more in one day than in his entire life, and he needs some peace and quiet.
5. The group of friends has to leave the waterfront before the tsunami comes, but Jackson can't walk because of his broken ankle.
